#### **NEWS IN A MINUTE: Environment -- Manager selected for Detroit River refuge**

The DetroitRiver's few remaining wetlands, marshes and undeveloped riverfront have a guardian.

John Hartig has been selected as the first manager for the 1,300-acre Detroit International Wildlife Refuge.

Hartig, who has served as river navigator in Detroit under the Greater Detroit American Heritage River Initiative, will become the refuge manager next month.

Hartig's selection was made by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which oversees the refuge, according to an announcement made Friday by the Metropolitan Affairs Coalition in Detroit.

The refuge, created in 2001 in large part through the efforts of U.S. Rep. John Dingell, a Trenton Democrat, includes several islands and shore areas that are either owned by the refuge or managed by it under agreement with the landowners.

The 409-acre Humbug Marsh was recently added to the holdings. The unspoiled tract includes waterfront marshes connecting with higher elevations of dry land and woods. The combination is ideal for many species of wildlife that need both types of habitat. By Hugh McDiarmid Jr.

Search concludes for man missing a year

Rangers at Glacier National Park in Montana have made a final and unsuccessful attempt to find a Michiganman who disappeared a year ago.

A truck belonging to Larry Kimble, 40, of Dorrwas found at the Rocky Point trailhead on the west shore of Lake MacDonald last June. A search last summer involved dogs and divers but was halted after wildfires made continued work too risky.

A search Monday involved five dogs.

"Pending further developments, the park's search for Mr. Kimble will now be suspended," the National Park Service said.

The truck contained a park entrance receipt dated May 29, 2003.

Rangers have found no indication of Kimble's activities since then. He did not have a back-country permit, and no camping equipment was in the truck. By the Associated Press

Patient caught, charged with trying to kill 4

State police using tracking dogs Sunday captured a man accused of trying to kill four people at a school in Michigan's Thumb after walking away from a psychiatric hospital. Corbin A. Thomas, 28, walked off Tuesday night after he was let out for a 15-minute break at the CaroCenter, a 200-bed psychiatric hospital, authorities say.

Thomas is believed to have attacked four workers Friday at the Learning Center, an alternative high school near the hospital. Teacher Patty Colburn-Spencer and custodian Larry Gettel both received skull fractures after being struck with a hammer. Paraprofessional Kristie Reh was stabbed.

A fourth person escaped injury.

Colburn-Spencer and Gettel were taken to St. Mary's Hospital in Saginaw.She was in serious condition and he was in fair condition Sunday. Reh was treated at Caro Community Hospital and released.

State police captured Thomas without incident Sunday morning in a heavily wooded area about 150 yards from the school, said Lt. Doug Lautner.

Thomas has been charged with four counts of assault

with intent to murder. Conviction can bring up to life in prison.

Thomas had been accused of committing fourth-degree criminal sexual conduct with a female student at Saginaw Valley State University on Nov. 1, 2002. A judge found him not guilty by reason of insanity and ordered him treated. By the Associated Press

**Michigan Tech University** has approved a budget for the 2004-2005 fiscal year that's 9.2 percent smaller than this year's budget, and likely will make budgeting for the following year even more difficult.

The current year's \$116.5 budget was marred by a \$6.29 million tuition miscalculation and state budget cuts that ended up meaning the school faced a \$7.5 million shortfall.

To make up for the loss, Chief Financial Officer Dan Greenlee told The Daily Mining Gazette of Houghton that the university is using about \$8 million in one-time funding, in cluding \$3.6 million in transfers from other funds into the general fund.

In addition, spending on financial aid will be cut \$835,000, and faculty and staff won't get raises next year.

Interim President Glen Mroz told The Daily Mining Gazette of Houghton that the balanced budget, to go into effect July 1, gives the school time to develop a plan that's in line with the school's goals.

"In a sense we're buying a year so we can continue on the road of making strategic decisions," Mroz told the Board of Control last week.

One of those honored on the plaques is Clarence White, known as "Cubby." The 84-yearold began working in the Marquette Iron Range after returning home from military service in 1946, and worked until seriously injuring his back in one of the mines in 1968.

"I'm just a small pea in the pod," White said. "Many men put their whole life in at the mines."

### **Clippers pair awaiting their NHL draft destiny**

Raymond Sawada was a penaltykilling forward on the third line in Richmond Junior B two years ago with a grand total of seven goals and 14 assists.

That same season, Jordan Foote was a AAA Midget player in Calgary with 16 goals and 18 assists and without a whiff of interest shown by the major junior WHL despite his six-foot-four, 200pound frame.

Sawada and Foote now stand on the verge of the 2004 NHL draft Saturday and Sunday in Raleigh, N.C., as the 33rd- and 69thranked North American skaters, respectively, by the Central Scouting Bureau.

That's thanks to just one season spent at the Island hockey foundry known as the Nanaimo Clippers, which takes unheralded and unpolished young skaters and spits out players with pro potential. The progress Sawada and Foote have made since joining the Clippers of the B.C. Hockey League last September has been remarkable -- from nowhere to somewhere in 10 shorts months.

"Both have size and skating ability and immense potential to one day use their abilities to draw a pay cheque at the pro level," said Clippers head coach and GM Bill Bestwick.

Bestwick saw something in the six-foot-one, 200-pound Sawada in Junior B that nobody else did.

"We saw his quick feet," said Bestwick.

"And this past season he blossomed with us. He tracks guys well and they feel it when he makes contact with them. He has the kind of physical presence all the pro guys have expressed a liking for."

Sawada is off next season to play in the U.S. university NCAA with the Cornell Big Red in the Ivy League. Foote, headed to **Michigan Tech** in 2005-06, will be back with the Clippers next season. If facing the defending BCHL champions isn't daunting enough a prospect for Clippers foes, they will also likely be up against an NHL draft pick.

"Jordan is tough but with nice hands and we really liked his skating ability," said Bestwick. "It's puzzling how he could have been missed by major junior. We're glad we saw him."

Finding overlooked gems isn't new for Bestwick's Clippers, who in 2000-01 plucked goaltender David LeNeveu out of Fernie, where he had been languishing in Junior B. LeNeveu became a second-round draft pick of the Phoenix Coyotes while at Cornell, setting off a run in which Sawada and Foote are poised to join LeNeveu, Byron Bitz, Tanner Glass, Shane Hynes and Ryan O'Byrne to become the sixth and seventh Clippers-produced players selected in the NHL draft in three years. In fairness, 2003 Montreal Canadiens draft pick O'Byrne was mostly a Victoria Salsa-refined player before a late-career trade to the Clippers. Still, the Clippers' recent draft clip is better than that of many major junior teams.

"It's a secondary point we make when we recruit, but we do make a point of noting our draft record to potential recruits because we believe it is noteworthy," said Bestwick.

"The BCHL is getting more respect in the draft because NHL teams know our players still have four years in the NCAA to develop and evolve and it gives the NHL teams a lot of time to see how their picks are developing before deciding to offer them a contract or not," noted Bestwick.

The numbers show the NHL likes that cushion as the tide continues to shift against major junior. Of the North American skaters and goalies rated by Central Scouting for the 2004 draft, 116 are from major junior compared to 145 from either Canadian Junior A leagues such as the BCHL, NCAA, U.S. junior or U.S. high school.

NHL teams look at many sources now in what remains essentially a crapshoot. Most of the players selected Saturday and Sunday will never play a game of pro hockey. A few will play at the minor pro level such as in the AHL and ECHL and only the select few will ever make it to the NHL.

No matter the odds, the Clippers have two players good enough to be in the chase this weekend.
