Reminder: New Procedure for Ordering Campus Nameplates

A new email procedure has been established for ordering Michigan Tech nameplates. All requests for nameplates and holders should be sent to mtusigns@mtu.edu .

Include the following information:

- * name and departmental association of person placing the order
- * name on the plate, taking into consideration capitalization and punctuation
- * account number (cannot be a research index)
- * nameplate size (sizes vary up to 8 by 12 inches)
- * desired size(s) of nameplate holder(s), including those for door or desk

Gilkerson Named Academic All-American

For the second straight year, senior Ken Gilkerson was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American Cross Country and Track and Field Team by the College Sports Information Directors of America. He finished 10th in the 800-meter run in a school record time of 1:51.08 at the 2010 NCAA Division II Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Gilkerson recently graduated with a 3.94 GPA in mechanical engineering.

The Brooklyn Park, Minn., native earned second-team honors this year after earning third-team honors a year ago. He was also the only student-athlete from the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference selected.

Other academic all-Americans for the Huskies this year include Katie Wysocky (women's basketball), Sarah Stream (women's basketball) and Eli Vlaisavljevich (at-large).

To be eligible for the district team, student-athletes must have a 3.2 cumulative GPA and completed two semesters at the institution.
